

HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS FROM THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

- Keep all vehicle doors locked while in or out of your car. Set your alarm.
- Avoid driving alone or at night.
- If you must shop at night, park in a well-lit area and remember where it's parked. This will get you in your car and on your way faster.
- Avoid parking next to vans or cars with tinted windows.
- Remember where you parked and have your keys ready when returning to your car.
- Hide purchases from view in your parked car to prevent break-ins. Lock valuables and packages in the trunk or put them out of sight. Secure them before you reach the parking lot. Thieves watch for people hiding items while in the parking lot.
- Keep a secure hold on your purse and packages.
- Always be aware of your surroundings.
- Do not approach your car alone if anyone seems suspicious in the area.
- Ask store security for an escort to your vehicle.
- Dress comfortably and avoid wearing expensive jewelry.
- Keep a record of all your credit card numbers in a safe place at home.
- Always be more careful, prepared, and aware during the holiday season.
- Pay for purchases with a credit card or check instead of carrying large amounts of cash. If you must carry cash, keep it in your front pocket.

- Pay for purchases with a credit card or check instead of carrying large amounts of cash. If you must carry cash, keep it in your front pocket.
- Be careful what you post online. Don't alert others that you aren't home while you're out shopping.
- Use the buddy system and shop with a friend. You're more likely to become a target if you're alone.
- Consolidate packages so you're a less desirable target for criminals looking to steal your belongings.
- Wear your purse across the body to keep your hands free for your keys when heading to your vehicle and into your home.
- Be just as vigilant about your surrounds during the daylight hours. A crime can occur at any time.
- Stay alert while walking to your vehicle. Talking or texting on your phone or looking in your purse for your keys while walking is a distraction and makes you an easy target.
- Check the back seat for potential criminals before getting in your car. Carry your keys in your hand while you're walking toward your vehicle, and pick a parking space that's easy to back out of so that you can leave the parking lot quickly.
- Women carrying a lot of packages are often targets for criminals because such shoppers are distracted and not as mobile.
