In the News - Sugarwood Stingray End-of-Summer recap

- ➡ The 2017 Sugarwood Stingrays returned to their winning ways after rejoining GKAISA League
 Two this summer. The team did not collect as many wins as the 2015 team, who went
 undefeated, but the 3-2 record means the Rays will remain in League Two for the 2018 summer.
- → Along with the success in interleague meets, the Stingrays had some dominant performances at the Smoky Mountain Invitational (SMI) and the GKAISA City Meet. Sugarwood won League Two at SMI and finished eleventh overall at the City Meet.
- ♣ The 11-12 mixed relay team consisting of Sugarwood residents Wrenna Morris, Dallas Carbaugh, Jackson Vineyard and Grace La Charite placed first overall at SMI and second at City.
- ← Catherine Brown and Grace La Charite, who are both Sugarwood residents, were key for the Stingrays as well. Brown collected 20 points and La Charite finished with a team high 51 in the female division. La Charite placed second overall in all four of her events at the City Meet.
- Westin Carbaugh led the team in points with 57. He got first in the 25 and 50 yard freestyle, as well as finishing second in the 25 yard breaststroke. His 100 yard medley relay team, in which his partners were Evan Tanaka, Sam Steger and Luke Vineyard, also finished first overall.
- → Jackson Vineyard and Frankie Von Hagen were also both important in the male division, racking up 44 and 41 points, respectively.
- Many of these accomplishments played a role in eight team event records that were broken this summer at the GKAISA City Meet.
- **↓** Sugarwood will look to build on this season with another successful year in 2018.
