

Michael Phelps. His name is instantly recognizable. He holds the record in seven of the sixteen men's Olympic swimming events.

Ever heard of Eamon Sullivan? Neither had I. He holds the Olympic record in the men's 100m Freestyle. But SOMEBODY somewhere knows him and cheered their heart out for him as he won that race.

The same holds for summer swim league. Somebody cares about every single lane in every single race. Someone cared about the swimmers who took second after Phelps and Sullivan too because it was truly quite an accomplishment and possibly their personal best time. That's the thing about swimming. Someone is on the deck for YOUR race who cares about YOUR goal, be that to finish the race, to master the turn, to better your time, or to be the first to touch the wall.

Speaking of records... your Stingrays are off to a record start in 2013! The April registration saw more smiles than ever before. There were smiles of all ages and sizes. There were familiar smiles and new ones, nervous smiles and confident, some barely three feet off the ground while others were well over six feet up.

Sugarwood Homeowners Association Sugarwood Pool Rules

- 1. Use of the Sugarwood Pool is restricted to Sugarwood Homeowners Association (SHA) members (and their accompanied guests) and Recreation Pass holders. Prior to entering the pool area, patrons must sign the register located at the pool entrance.
- 2. Swimsuits must be worn in the pool at all times.
 - No street clothing, including cut-offs are permitted in the pool
 - Children who are not potty trained must wear <u>swimmies or swim diapers</u> in the pool. Cloth or regular disposable diapers are NOT allowed.
- 3. Children ten (10) and under must be accompanied by an adult. Children aged nine to thirteen (9 to 13) must demonstrate the swimming ability to the lifeguard (once per season) before being allowed to swim unaccompanied. Parents assume all responsibilities / damages for the actions of their unaccompanied children.
- 4. Children over the age of eight (8) are not permitted in the baby pool. Children in the baby pool are required to be attended by an adult at all times.
- 5. No running, jumping, or horseplay is permitted within the pool area.
- 6. Patrons should stay off lane lines, ropes, and the lifeguard stand.
- 7. General pool toys are allowed as long as they are used properly and do not impair visibility to the bottom of the pool. No rafts or dive sticks.
- 8. Diving is restricted to the diving board and deep end of the pool. Flips, twists, or somersaults from the side of the pool are not permitted at any time. Use ladder in the diving well when board is in use.
- 9. GLASS AND CERAMIC ITEMS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE POOL AREA. Non-alcoholic beverages may be brought into the pool area if in unbreakable, disposable containers. NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ALLOWED AT ANY TIME. Throw container in trash before leaving.
- 10. FOOD IS NOT ALLOWED ON THE POOL DECK OR WITHIN 6' OF THE POOL EDGE. Please eat in the shelter area and remember to clean up your mess when finished.
- 11. An "adult swim" (for individuals 18 years of age or older) will take place 10 minutes to the hour on the hour. Upon indication by the Lifeguards that it is time for the "adult swim", all persons under the age of 18 will be required to leave the pool.
- 12. Lifeguards have the responsibility and authority to require patrons to "sit out" for discipline infractions of the Pool Rules or other unsafe/unruly conduct. Three infractions in a single day will result in the child being sent home. Serious and/or repeated disciplinary problems will be referred to the SHA Board of Directors for resolution. Disciplinary actions may include loss of pool privileges for the remainder of the season.
- 13. The pool office is to be used only by the Pool Manager, Lifeguards, or other authorized persons. Permission must be obtained from the Pool Manager or Lifeguard, to enter this area. The telephone in the pool office is for business and emergency use. Social calls are not to be made from this telephone.

THE POOL SHOULD BE A SAFE & FUN PLACE FOR EVERYONE!
PLEASE DO NOT DISTRACT THE LIFEGUARDS OR PLAY WITH THE RESCUE
EQUIPMENT. BOTH ARE THERE TO HELP ENSURE THE SAFETY OF ALL SWIMMERS.
